

Where to Go in Vancouver

Vancouver, summer and winter, is a spectacular place for sight seeing. Here's just seven visitor must see tours; all accessible by public transit.

- Ride **SkyTrain from North Vancouver Public Market (using the Seabus) across the Fraser River and back...** a relaxing, sightseeing tour of Greater Vancouver.
- Birds eyeview: for n overall view of the city, the **Grouse Mountain Sky Ride** gives a spectacular panorama of Vancouver and across the Gulf to Vancouver Island. It's also a great spot for lunch and checking out the Grizzly bear cubs near the top station.
- **Shopping and people-watching on Robson Street** between Granville and Bute Streets is a favourite with Vancouverites and visitors alike. Great in late evening when the many residents of the downtown area keep Robson St very lively. Great restaurants too!
- Don't miss Vancouver's unique 'rain forest in the middle of the city', **Stanley Park**.
 - pet a Beluga whale in the Park's **Aquarium**
 - smell the roses in the **Rose Garden**.
 - See the vistas from spectacular **Brockton Point** ...downtown Vancouver, passing cruise ships under Lions Gate Bridge, and take mug shots in front of the totems; or maybe watch a cricket game!
- **Chinatown** in Vancouver is one of North Americas largest and most colourful, and hosts the famous **Sun Yat-Sen Chinese Garden** before/after a unique **Dim-Sum lunch** in any of many restaurants in the area.
- **Granville Island Public Market** and a walk along the south **False Creek Sea Wall**, were a 30 minute interesting walk (no cars) brings you to **Science World** at the east end of the Creek.
- Finally, whether you're staying on the UBC Campus or not, be sure to take in the **Anthropological Museum**, one of the finest exhibits of native culture in North America.
